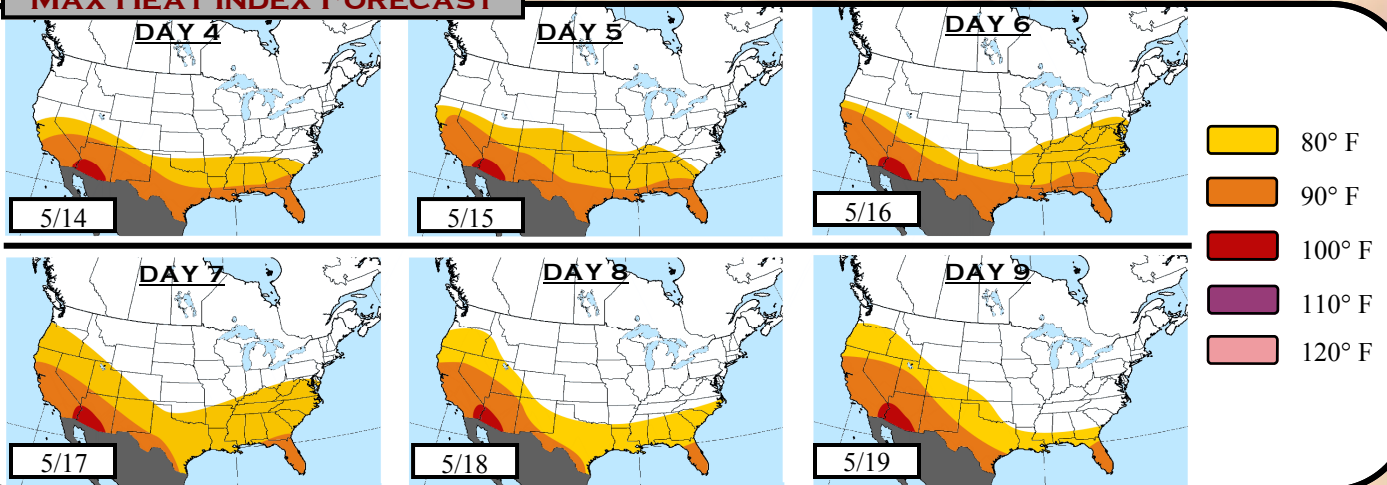

DISCUSSION

CONTINUED HIGH HEAT IN SW
WEST HEAT EXPANDS LATE

High heat in the southwest is showing no signs of slowing down in the 1-10 day period. Highs in Phoenix will hold in the low to mid 100's through day 10 and highs in Las Vegas will remain in the mid to upper 90's throughout. The heat will continue to expand westward and northward, especially as the 6-10 day period approaches. Highs are forecast to make it into the 80's in Portland and Salt Lake City by day 7, and into the 90's in Burbank by day 6. The Midwest and East Coast are looking much more mild, with above normal temperatures mainly forecast for days 4-7. A cool-down late in the 6-10 day period will bring temperatures back down to below to near normal across the Midwest and East. Texas can expect warmer than usual weather early, with highs forecast to reach near 90 in Houston days 1-6, and highs in the mid to upper 80's days 2-6 in Dallas.
